MATERIALS LIST

Go-To Ripple Tote

Materials

- Premier Yarns Premier Home Cotton Solids medium (worsted) weight cotton/polyester yarn (2¾ oz/140 yds/80g per ball):
 - 2 balls each #3812 turquoise and #3817 passion fruit
- Premier Yarns Premier Home Cotton Multis medium (worsted) weight cotton/polyester yarn (2 oz/105 yds/ 60g per ball):
 - 2 balls #4406 water lilies
- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size E/4/3.5mm crochet hook for finishing and Straps only
- Straight pins (optional)
- Tapestry needle



Blue Waves Washcloth

Materials

- Universal Yarn Cotton Supreme medium (worsted) weight cotton yarn (3½ oz/180 yds/ 100g per hank):
 - 1 hank #516 aqua
- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook for foundation chain
- Tapestry needle



Lavender & Lilac Chevron Scarf

Materials

- Premier Yarns Ever Soft medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (3 oz/ 158yds/85g per skein):
 - 2 skeins each #27 lavender and #26 iris
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook for foundation chain
- Locking stitch marker
- Tapestry needle



Peekaboo Cowl

Materials

- Caron Simply Soft medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (6 oz/ 315 yds/170g per skein):
 - 1 skein #9609 berry blue
- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook for foundation chain
- Tapestry needle



Happy Waves Toddler Blanket

Materials

- Caron Simply Soft medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (6 oz/ 315yds/170g per skein):
 - 3 skeins each #9767 royal blue and #9776 lemonade
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size K/10½/6.5mm crochet hook for foundation chain
- Tapestry needle
