## MATERIALS LIST

### Gentle Waves Hairpin Lace Scarf



#### Materials

- Universal Deluxe Worsted Superwash medium (worsted) weight superwash wool yarn (3½ oz/220 yds/100g per ball):  
2 balls #721 honeysuckle
- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Hairpin lace frame
- Locking stitch markers

### Simply Elegant Hairpin Lace Scarf



#### Materials

- Berroco Weekend medium (worsted) weight acrylic/cotton yarn (3½ oz/205 yds/100g per hank):  
2 hanks #5944 starry night
- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Hairpin lace frame
- Locking stitch markers

### Baby Love Broomstick Blanket



#### Materials

- Plymouth DK Merino Superwash light (light worsted) weight superwash wool yarn (1¼ oz/130 yds/50g per hank):  
6 hanks #1017 cilantro (A)  
1 hank #1001 natural (B)
- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size 35/19mm knitting needle
- Tapestry needle

### Broomstick Lace Shawlette



#### Materials

- Berroco Vintage light (DK) weight acrylic/wool/nylon yarn (3½ oz/288 yds/100g per hank):  
2 hanks #2183 lilacs
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size 35/19mm knitting needle
- Tapestry needle

### Sunbeam Bruges Lace Table Runner



#### Materials

- Premier Cotton Fair fine (sport) weight cotton/acrylic yarn (3½ oz/317 yds/100g per ball):  
2 balls #2711 lemon drop
- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle

### Bruges Lace Tunic



#### Materials

- Universal Uptown DK light (light worsted) weight acrylic yarn (3½ oz/273 yds/100g per ball):  
4 [4, 5, 5] balls #103 blush
- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Locking stitch markers: 5
