Learn to Wet Felt Fanciful Flowers

MATERIALS LIST

Wet Felted Flowers

Tools

- 12 x 18-inch piece bubble wrap with small bubbles
- 9-inch square tulle netting
- Dowel rod (1-inch diameter) or rolling pin
- · Dishwashing liquid or olive oil soap
- 2 medium-size bowls
- · 2 medium-size towels
- 18 x 24-inch rectangle of thin plastic from trash bag
- Sponge
- Metal knitting needle or small wooden dowel or pencil
- Scissors
- Ruler
- · Hot and cool water
- Small strip of aluminum foil about 4 inches long x width of foil roll
- Paper copy of template (see page 5)
- Apron or protective clothing for playing in water

Felting Supplies

- Merino wool fiber (top or roving) rope for each flower: 18-inch length in variegated hand-dyed colors of choice, 3 (9-inch) lengths in solid coordinating colors, 20-inch length in green
- Silk threads
- Very small amount Angelina or Firestar fiber
- Bamboo fibers, curly locks (wool or mohair) (optional)



- Small handful of 1–3 colors coarser wool fiber (Corriedale, for example)
- Approximately 24 inches size 5 or 8 pearl cotton in desired color
- Large-eye needle (I use a size ½ crewel embroidery needle)
- Wide rubber band to grip needle
- Thimble
- Pinback
- Sewing thread to match flower
- Straight pins

Project note: Do not use superwash wool; it will not felt. Merino wool fiber is sold by the ounce. A 20-inch length of the fiber rope weighs approximately 0.2 oz.

Spiral Leaf Napkin Ring

Tools

- 12 x 24-inch piece bubble wrap with small bubbles
- 10-inch pieces plastic wrap, 2 for each napkin ring
- 2 small rubber bands
- Rulei
- · Dishwashing liquid or olive oil soap
- Hot and cool water
- 2 medium-size bowls
- · 2 medium-size towels
- Sewing needle
- · Matching sewing thread
- Straight pins
- 2 small rubber bands
- Tacky glue
- Apron or protective clothing for playing in water

Felting Supplies

 24-inch section merino wool (top or roving) rope about 1 inch in diameter (for 1 napkin ring)

Project note: Do not use superwash wool; it will not felt. Merino wool fiber is sold by the ounce. Section of merino should squeeze down to a $\frac{1}{4}$ - $\frac{3}{8}$ -inch diameter when twisted.

Spiral Leaf Bracelet

Tools

- 12 x 44-inch piece bubble wrap with small bubbles
- 10-inch pieces plastic wrap, 2 for each bracelet
- · 2 small rubber bands
- Ruler
- · Dishwashing liquid or olive oil soap
- Hot and cool water
- 2 medium-size bowls
- 2 medium-size towels
- Sewing needle
- Matching sewing thread
- Straight pins
- Apron or protective clothing for playing in water

Felting Supplies

 44 x 1-inch length merino wool (top or roving) rope

Project notes: Do not use superwash wool; it will not felt. Merino wool fiber is sold by the ounce. Section of merino should squeeze down to a 3-inch diameter when twisted.

Wool Bead Acorns

Tools

- Dishwashing liquid or olive oil soap
- · Hot and cool water
- 2 medium-size bowls
- 2 medium-size towels
- Apron or protective clothing for playing in water

Felting Supplies

- Small handful of 1–3 colors coarser wool fiber (Corriedale, for example)
- Small amount Angelina or Firestar fiber (optional)
- Bamboo fibers (optional)
- Tacky glue
- Natural acorn tops
